The Arc Fond du Lac was first established in 1963 to address the growing need in the community to serve families who have loved ones with disabilities. As part of a national network of organizations dedicated to providing support and services for people with I/DD, The Arc Fond du Lac has grown to be the largest Arc chapter in Wisconsin. Presently, The Arc serves over 750 individuals with disabilities annually. The Arc has primarily received its operating revenue from Medicaid funding of individual clients of The Arc. This revenue source has proven to be inconsistent, with service rates fluctuating from year to year. Through this, The Arc has remained dedicated to providing high-quality services for all individuals who require assistance. Be-

For the past eight years, The Arc Fond du Lac has a been running an impactful Youth Enrichment Program for children with disabilities. The program consists of after-school, Saturday, and summer respite. Individualized activities are provided for each youth attending, including educational and health and wellness programming. Our foundational approach of the program is to teach our youth respectful and appropriate methods of communication and interaction. Youth whom attend this program have the opportunity to develop independent skills, gain a greater sense of self-awareness and confidence. Families have recognized this program as a true benefit, allowing parents to also live an enriched life.

A special treat for the participants is when groups or individuals volunteer for the program. In December, a local school group volunteered to come in and help our children make some special snacks. In all, dozens of cookies were decorated by the group, but much more importantly, friendships were developed. If one were to ask the children involved, another important point is that the cookies were delicious!

Volunteers at The Arc Fond du Lac come in with a variety of talents and interests to share with our clients. Often groups come from organizations, companies, or schools. The Arc is also fortunate to have many individuals who donate their time with our programs. Community Enrichment Community Enrichment



The Arc's Community Enrichment Program provides adults with disabilities many opportunities for safe, fun and supportive experiences in public environments. Whether it's learning about reading nutritional food labels while grocery shopping, attending local concerts, or going out for a leisurely fishing trip the CEP participants are a common entity in the community. One of the larger roles that the CEP performs is the coordination of our competitive sporting teams. The Arc has several Basketball, Bocce Ball, Swimming, and Bowling teams. Our teams compete throughout the state, with many awards and state-wide place holdings credited to the athletes at The Arc. Recently, The Arc wrapped up our competitive bowling season with much success. This year, 82 bowlers participated in competition. Five of our teams and one person competing in the individual division advanced to the

state competition. One of our teams took away a bronze, two teams took silver, and our individual bowler took home the gold medal. When asked about this state wide sweep, an Arc athlete said "I like to bowl, I'm pretty good at it and we practice a lot. But I really like being with my friends, and my coach is fun to be around."

Home Sweet Home



The Arc Fond du Lac's Residential Services is growing leaps and bounds. Six of our Arc residents have moved into two new adult family homes in December. These houses were built specifically to address the needs of individuals with disabilities while providing a well-built and beautiful home. An Arc property that was formerly an adult family home is in the process of being completely remodeled, turning it into the only respite home in the Fond du Lac area. This home will be used to provide parents and caregivers a safe and well-run home for their loved ones to stay for a short while. Opening in May, our respite home will be staffed by Arc employees who are some of the best-trained residential staff in the state. In addition to this growth, The Arc will be constructing two additional adult family homes to be occupied by early fall of 2015.

The Arc Fond du Lac houses a transportation department unique to our area. Our fleet of 26 vehicles is not only available to our various programs to provide our clients transportation, but twelve other area organizations utilize our mini-busses, vans, and cars. In 2014, Arc Transportation provided 23,260 rides for individuals. Our vehicles traversed 249,989 miles this year. Our vehicles are available for use by other organizations and individuals.
